Teaching for the future: the classroom as a pathway to global citizenship

Globalization must be about much more than trade and capital flows. It should also be about creating a shared citizenship – a shared humanity - based on common ethical principles and values that transcend culture, tradition and religion. The task of preparing tomorrow's global citizens weighs heavily on today's teachers. This lecture seeks to explore questions important to all those involved in education:

How can teachers help prepare their students to participate in shaping tomorrow's world?

How can the classroom itself become a pathway to global citizenship?



Speaker: Dr Anne Gallagher AO

Dr Anne Gallagher has built a formidable career as a lawyer, practitioner, teacher and scholar with a significant international reputation in human rights and the administration of criminal justice. Anne worked for the United Nations for twelve years and during this time she was closely involved in developing the international legal framework around human trafficking and migrant smuggling. Resigning from the UN in 2003, she moved her attention to the front lines and has since been working in South East Asia to develop more effective criminal justice responses to human trafficking. This initiative, funded by the Australian Government, has been widely acclaimed for its impact both within and outside the region.

Anne juggles her international development work with regular guest lecturer positions at some of the world's best universities, consulting to the UN and authoring numerous scholarly works on trafficking, human rights and the rule of law. In 2011 she was awarded the inaugural

Australian Freedom Award for her international leadership in the area of trafficking. The following year she was appointed Officer of the Order of Australia and was also named a 2012 *Trafficking in Persons Hero* by the then US Secretary of State Hilary Clinton. In 2013 Anne was named the inaugural ANU *Alumni of the Year*.
